



KEY FINDINGS



- 88% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 78% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school.
- 81% of Hispanic students in the region are in Level 1+/1 seats, compared to 96% of White students.
- There are mostly Level 1+/1 schools in the region, plus three Level 2+ schools and five Level 2 schools.
- There are 1,874 unfilled elementary seats and 436 unfilled high school seats, despite some over enrollment.
- Of all Level 1+/1 elementary seats, 84% are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria. All Level 1+/1 high school seats have at least some programs with admissions criteria, citywide boundaries, or both.



- The CPS population in the region has decreased by about 600 students (1.2%), since the 2014-2015 school year.
- Enrollment in schools in the region has dropped by over 1,100 students (2.4%), less than the citywide decline (6.0%).
- There are currently 2,883 more seats than students enrolled in the region.




- 14% of CPS elementary students and 38% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 70% of CPS elementary students and 34% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school.
- Of elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 27% travel under one mile. Of high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 55% travel over three miles and 25% travel over six miles.



- All elementary school programs are represented in the region.
- For high schools, there are no selective enrollment schools. There are no Fine & Performing Arts programs offered, although there is a World Language program.

The Far Northwest Side region is bounded generally by W Howard St and W Touhy Ave, Interstates 94 and 90, the Milwaukee District North METRA Line, and the Des Plaines River. It is home to 328,000 residents and is served by 16 transit stops.




DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION

The Far Northwest Side region is consistently majority Hispanic and a quarter White.

The CPS students in the Far Northwest Side region are majority Hispanic (68%) which has not changed in the past four years, despite a drop of about 600 students. 24% of the students are White, which has also not shifted in that time. The share of African American students has not changed (2%) and the share of Asian

students has risen slightly (3% to 4%). The number and share of students qualified for FRL has also dropped from 77% to 68% in the past four years, which is consistent with the district's decline but lower than the district average.


HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

School attendance boundary view shows school quality disparities within the region.

ELEMENTARY

The elementary schools in the Far Northwest Side region are primarily Level 1+/1. Attendance boundaries in the northern half of the region are primarily Level 1+, whereas the southern half has mostly Level 1 attendance boundaries. Towards the southern edge of the region, there are a few Level 2+/2 attendance boundaries and citywide schools.






HIGH SCHOOL

There are five attendance area high schools in the Far Northwest Side region. Taft High School (Level 1) is in the northern half; Steinmetz's (Level 2+) attendance boundaries take up the southwestern section; and Schurz, Foreman, and Kelvyn Park (Level 2) are in the southeastern section. There are also Level 1+/1 citywide high schools in the southern half.






HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

There is an increasing number of Level 1+/1 seats.²



Over the past four years there has been an increase in the number of Level 1+/1 schools in the region, from 30 to 42. In the 2017-2018 school year, 42 out of 50 schools are Level 1+/1. The number of Level 2 schools has dropped from seven to five and there are no Level 3 schools.

There has been a subsequent increase in the number of Level 1+/1 seats. For elementary school students, the number of Level 1+/1 seats has risen by over 7,000 seats. For high school students, the number of Level 1+/1 seats has risen by over 5,500 seats and the number of Level 2 seats has fallen by over 2,200 seats.





There is increasing enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools.



A greater percentage of CPS elementary students are attending a Level 1+/1 school each year. In the past four years, the percentage of students attending a Level 1+/1 school has increased from 71% to 88%. However, the percentage attending a Level 2 school has risen in the past year from 2% to 7%.

In the past four years the percentage of CPS high school students attending a Level 1+/1 school has increased from 31% to 78%, and the percentage attending a Level 2 school has decreased from 35% to 12%.





There is a disparity in quality between Hispanic and White CPS students, the two significant student populations. 81% of Hispanic students attend a Level 1+/1 school, compared to 96% of White students, and 11% attend a Level 2 school, compared to 1% of White students.





DO STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS?





ADMISSION TYPE OF LEVEL 1+ OR 1 SCHOOLS





Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 44% are at citywide schools with no admissions criteria. 48% are at schools that have some programs with criteria (32% at attendance area schools and 16% at citywide schools). The other 8% are at citywide schools with criteria.


Northwest Side region has dropped slightly in the past few years - fewer than 600 students, a decline of 1.2%, compared to the 6.0% citywide decline in CPS students. K-8th CPS population has fallen by 1.3% (compared to district 6.4%) and 9-12th CPS population has increased slightly (less than 1%, compared to district -3.1%).








School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice has been increasing slightly among CPS elementary school students. Since the 2014-2015 school year, the percentage of students attending their zoned school has fallen from 73% to 70% and the percentage attending school out of the region has risen from 13% to 14%.



Of the 33,909 CPS elementary students residing in the region, 89% attend a Level 1+ school. This percentage is relatively constant across school choice, although it is highest among students attending their zoned school (91%) and lowest among students who go out of the region (76%).



Of the 4.656 CPS students who attend school out of region (see above). 76% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This rate is lowest for African American students -55% of the 225 African American students attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 20% attend a Level 2 school. Among Hispanic students, 72% attend Level 1+/1 schools and 10% attend Level 2 schools.





FAR NORTHWEST SIDE: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (K-8TH)







In the past four years, the percentage of students attending their zoned school has dropped from 42% to 34% and the percentage leaving the region for school has risen from 35% to 38%.



Of the 13,326 CPS high school students in the region, 78% attend a Level 1+/1 school. However, this varies moderately by school choice. 57% of students attending their zoned school (Taft) are at a Level 1 school; there are no Level 1+ zoned schools. 85% of students who attend a different school in the region are at a Level 1+/1 school and 93% of students who leave the region are.

STUDENTS WHO ATTEND SCHOOL OUT OF REGION - RACIAL/ETHNIC BREAKDOWN






Of the 5,004 CPS high school students who attend school out of the region (see above), 93% attend a Level 1+/1 school (72% are at Level 1+ schools and 21% are at Level 1 schools). This rate is lowest for African American students – 69% of African American students who leave the region for school attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 12% are at a Level 2 school – however, they are the smallest racial/ethnic group in the region. Of Hispanic students, the largest racial/ethnic group in the region, 92% are at Level 1+/1 schools.




FAR NORTHWEST SIDE: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (9TH-12TH)
