



ANNUAL REGIONAL ANALYSIS





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR¹

5,173 STUDENTS IN REGION | 11 SCHOOLS | 8% HISPANIC | 48% AFRICAN AMERICAN | 41% WHITE | 1% ASIAN


KEY FINDINGS

QUALITY	 59% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school and 68% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school. 13% of African American students attend a Level 2 school, compared to 0% of White students. There are 11 schools, six of which are Level 1+/1, four of which are Level 2+, and one
	 of which is Level 2. There are 206 unfilled Level 1+/1 elementary seats and 122 unfilled Level 1+ high school seats. 91% of Level 1+/1 elementary seats have no admissions criteria. All Level 1+ high schools seats have citywide boundaries and admissions criteria.
QUANTITY	 The CPS population in the region has dropped by 7.6% (about 400 students) since the 2014-2015 school year, which is greater than the citywide decline of 6.0%. Enrollment in schools in the region has dropped slightly less (4.9%, about 300 students). There are currently 612 more seats than students enrolled in the region.
CHOICE	 13% of CPS elementary students and 44% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 79% of CPS elementary students and 22% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school. Of elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 15% travel under 1 mile and 51% travel over three miles. Of high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school students of their zoned school, 61% travel over 3 miles and 37% travel over 6 miles.

- There are no selective enrollment high schools in the region. There are no Fine & ٠ Performing Arts or STEM programs offered in high school, although there is a high school World Language program.



MAP




The Far Southwest Side region is generally bounded by W 87th St to the north, the city boundary to the west and south, and S Beverly Ave and S Vincennes Ave to the east. It is home to 62,000 residents and is served by seven train stops.

DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION

The Far Southwest Side region has become less African American and more White.

The racial/ethnic composition of the Far Southwest Side CPS population is primarily African American and White. The percentage of African American CPS students has dropped from 49% to 48% and the percentage of White students has risen from 39% to 41% in the past four years. The percentage of students qualified for FRL has dropped from 46% to 39% in that time, which is lower than the district average.



There are two high schools in the region. Morgan Park (Level 2+) has an attendance boundary that includes all students who reside anywhere within the region. There is also Chicago Agricultural High School, a Level 1+ citywide high school.



High School Attendance Area (School location INSIDE Zone)







HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?


There is a decreasing number of Level 1+/1 seats.²

QUALITY



There are currently 11 schools in the region, including nine elementary schools and two high schools. The number of Level 1+/1 schools fell from eight to seven between the 2014-2015 and 2016-2017 school years, and down to six in the past year.

NOTE: This graph does not include Options or Specialty schools.



The number of Level 1+/1 seats has generally been decreasing for elementary schools and remained relatively constant (except for a dip in capacity) in high schools. Between the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 school years, the number of Level 1+/1 elementary seats fell by 300 and the number of Level 2 increased by 300. There are only two high schools, and for the past three years Chicago Agricultural has been Level 1+ (although its capacity was adjusted down by 252 seats) and Morgan Park has been Level 2+ (and its capacity adjusted down by 156 seats).





HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS **ARE THERE?**




There is constant or decreasing enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools.



The percentage of CPS elementary students attending Level 1+/1 schools has generally decreased in the past four years, and between last year and this year it dropped from 61% to 59%. Almost all of the Inability to Rate seats are at PE/PK schools.

The percentage of CPS high school students attending Level 1+/1 schools has generally been increasing. In the 2014-2015 school year, 52% of CPS high school students attended a Level 1+/1 school; this year, 68% of CPS high school students living in the region are at a Level 1+/1 school. including 62% at a Level 1+ school.




The Far Southwest Side region student population is primarily African American and White. 74% of White students are at Level 1+/1 schools, compared to 48% of African American students: 13% of African American students are at Level 2 schools, compared to just seven White students (0%).






DO STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS?






1,614 elementary students who live in the region do not attend a Level 1+/1 school (see previous page). There are 206 unfilled Level 1+/1 elementary seats in the region.

Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 80% are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria. 11% are at citywide schools with no criteria. The other 9% are at citywide schools with criteria.







The number of students enrolled in schools in the region has dropped by about 300 students (4.9%), which is less than the rate of decline of the CPS population in the region. K-8th grade enrollment has dropped by 3.6% and 9-12th grade enrollment has dropped by 6.9%.



ARE STUDENTS CHOOSING SCHOOLS IN THEIR REGION?





School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice among CPS elementary school students has been relatively constant in the Far Southwest Side region. The percentage of CPS students attending their zoned school has fallen from 80% to 79% and the percentage attending school out of the region has increased from 12% to 13%.

Of the 3,704 CPS elementary students residing in the Far Southwest Side region, 61% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This is relatively constant across school choice. However, students who attend school out of the region attend a Level 1+/1 school at a higher rate (66%) but also attend Level 2 schools at a higher rate (11%) than those who attend school in the region.

STUDENTS WHO ATTEND SCHOOL OUT OF REGION – RACIAL/ETHNIC BREAKDOWN



Of the 479 CPS students who attend school outside of the region (see above), 66% attend a Level 1+/1 school. There is a disparity in quality by race/ethnicity – 62% of African American students attend Level 1+/1 schools, compared to 82% of White students.






School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice in the region has increased significantly among CPS high schoolers. The percentage of CPS high school students attending their zoned school has dropped from 32% to 22% in four years, and the percentage leaving the region has risen from 40% to 44%.

Of the 1,259 CPS high school students residing in the region, 68% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This varies significantly by school choice – the students who attend their zoned school are at Morgan Park (Level 2+), and the students who attend a nonzoned school in the region are at Chicago Agriculture High School (Level 1+). Of the students who attend school out of the region, 77% are at a Level 1+/1 school and 11% are at a Level 2 school.

Of the 550 CPS high school students who attend school out of region (see above), 77% are at a Level 1+/1 school. This rate is lower for African American students, who make up 72% of students who attend school out of the region. 72% of African American students attend a Level 1+/1 school and 15% attend a Level 2 school, compared to 94% of White students who attend a Level 1+/1 school and 0% of whom attend a Level 2 school.






