


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR¹

KEY FINDINGS



- 48% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 56% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school.
- 29% of African American students attend a Level 2 or Level 3 school, compared to 2% of Hispanic students.
- There are 45 schools, 21 of which are Level 1+/1, 10 of which are Level 2, and two of which are Level 3.
- There are over 3,500 unfilled Level 1+/1 elementary seats and over 900 unfilled Level 1+/1 high school seats.
- 98% of Level 1+/1 elementary seats are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria. Of all Level 1+/1 high school seats, 63% are at citywide schools with admissions criteria, and the other 37% are at attendance area schools that have some programs with criteria.



- The CPS population in the region has dropped by 7.1% (1,700 students) since the 2014-2015 school year, which is slightly greater than the citywide decline of 6.0%.
- Enrollment in schools in the region has dropped by 1.160 students, a decline of 5.6%.
- There are currently 13,134 more seats than students enrolled.


- 18% of CPS elementary students and 42% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 63% of CPS elementary students and 31% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school.
- Of CPS elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 30% travel under one mile. Of high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 68% travel over three miles and 36% travel over six miles.



- All elementary and high school programs are represented, including an Academic Center option, an RGC/Classical option, and five CTE programs.
- There are relatively few IB seats for both elementary and high schools (compared to the number of students in the region).
- The region lacks a high school Fine & Performing Arts program.

The Greater Calumet region is generally bounded by 95th St, 100th St and 103rd St to the north, Interstate 57 to the west, the city boundary to the south, and the Illinois-Indiana state border to the east. It is home to 135,600 and is served by 12 train stops.







The Greater Calumet region is becoming slightly less African American and more Hispanic.

The racial/ethnic composition of the Greater Calumet CPS population is roughly two-thirds African American and one-third Hispanic. The percentage of African American students has dropped slightly in the past four years, from 67% to 65%, and the percentage of Hispanic

students has risen from 31% to 32%. The percentage of students qualified for FRL has dropped from 92% to 85% in the past four years, which is consistent with the district's decline but higher than the district average.








The Greater Calumet region mainly encompasses neighborhoods of low to medium median household income.



HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?


School attendance boundary view shows school quality disparities within the region.



HIGH SCHOOL

The eastern half of the Greater Calumet region falls into the attendance boundary for Washington High School (Level 1); the western half falls into the attendance boundaries of Fenger, Julian, and Corliss High Schools (all Level 2). There are four citywide schools, plus Carver Military High School.






HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

There is a fluctuating number of Level 1+/1 seats.²



There are currently 45 schools in the region, including 36 elementary schools and nine high schools. There are 21 Level 1+/1 schools, up from 19 in 2014-15; 10 Level 2 schools, down from nine in the 2014-2015 school year; and two Level 3 schools, down from five.

NOTE: This graph does not include Options or Specialty schools.



The number of Level 1+/1 seats has increased for elementary and high schools in the past four years, despite a dip in the past year. For elementary schools, the number of Level 1+/1 seats has risen by over 1,400; the number of Level 2 seats has fallen by over 1,100; and the number of Level 3 seats has fallen by over 1,400 since 2014-2015. For high schools, the number of Level 1+/1 seats has risen by almost 700 seats; the number of Level 2 seats has also risen by over 1,400 seats; and the number of Level 3 seats has fallen by over 1,700 since 2014-2015.





HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?


There is a general increase in enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools.



The percentage of CPS elementary students attending Level 1+/1 schools increased from 41% to 70% between the 2014-2015 and 2016-2017 school years and fell to 48% in 2017-18. The percentage of CPS students attending Level 2 schools has decreased from 19% to 16% since the 2014-2015 school year and the percentage attending Level 3 schools has fallen from 9% to 4%.

The percentage of CPS high school students attending Level 1+/1 schools has increased from 25% to 56% since the 2014-2015 school year, although it has fallen since 2016-2017. The percentage attending a Level 2 school has decreased from 28% to 21% in that time, and the percentage attending a Level 3 school fell from 14% to 0%.






The Greater Calumet region is mainly made up of African American and Hispanic CPS students. African American and Hispanic students attend Level 1+ schools at the same rate (20%), but not Level 1 schools (24% of African American students, compared to 44% of Hispanic students). Moreover, 25% of African American students attend Level 2 schools, compared to 2% of Hispanic students, and 4% of African American students attend Level 3 schools.








HOW MANY SEATS ARE THERE FOR THE STUDENT POPULATION?






The number of CPS students who live in Greater Calumet region has dropped by 1,700 (7.1%), which is slightly greater than the 6.0% citywide decline. The K-8th grade CPS population has dropped by 6.5% (compared to district 6.4%) and the 9-12th grade population has dropped by 7.3% (compared to district 3.1%).




The number of students enrolled in the region has dropped by 1,160 students (5.6%), less than the rate of change for student population. K-8th grade enrollment has dropped by 5.6% and 9-12th grade enrollment has dropped by 4.3%.



There are 13,134 more seats than students enrolled in the region, including 7,738 elementary school seats and 5,396 high school seats.



ARE STUDENTS CHOOSING SCHOOLS IN THEIR REGION?




School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice among CPS elementary school students has increased slightly over the past four years. The percentage of students attending their zoned school has fallen from 66% to 63% and the percentage attending school out of the region has increased from 17% to 18%.

Of the 14,920 CPS elementary students residing in the Greater Calumet region, 48% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This is relatively consistent across school choice. 52% of students who attend their zoned school go to a Level 1+/1 school; for students who attend school outside the region, 47% are at a Level 1+/1 school. Of students who choose to attend a non-zoned school but stay in the region, only 37% attend a Level 1+/1 school (27% attend a Level 2 school and 5% attend a Level 3 school).

Of the 2,666 CPS elementary students who attend school out of the region (see above), most are African American. Of African American students, 46% attend Level 1+/1 schools. There are 158 Hispanic students, who have a higher rate of attending Level 1+/1 schools (58%).







How are students exercising school choice, and how far are they traveling?




GREATER CALUMET: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (K-8TH)




School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice in the Greater Calumet region has increased slightly among CPS high schoolers. The percentage of high school students attending their zoned school has dropped from 34% to 31% in four years, and the percentage leaving the region has remained 42%.

HIGH SCHOOL



Of the 6,152 CPS high school students living in the South Side region, 56% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This varies slightly by school choice. 52% of students who attend a non-zoned school in the region are at Level 1+/1 schools. Of the students who leave the region for school, 50% are at Level 1+/1 schools. Of the students who attend their zoned school, 68% are at Level 1 school but none attend Level 1+ schools.



Of the 2,587 CPS high school students attending school out of region, most are African American. Of these students, 45% attend Level 1+/1 schools. There are 341 Hispanic students, who have a higher rate of attending Level 1+/1 schools (81%).








GREATER CALUMET: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (9TH-12TH)




