

KEY FINDINGS

QUALITY

- 78% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 54% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school.
- 70% of Hispanic students attend Level 1+/1 schools, compared to 89% of Asian students.
- There are 33 schools, 24 of which are Level 1+/1.
- There are 2,342 unfilled Level 1+ elementary seats and 474 unfilled Level 1+ high school seats.
- No elementary Level 1+/1 seats have admissions criteria. Of all Level 1+/1 high school seats, 100% have citywide boundaries and 50% have some programs with criteria.

QUANTITY

- The CPS population in the region has decreased by 7.4% (about 1,700 students) since the 2014-2015 school year, greater than the citywide decline of 6.0%.
- Enrollment in schools in the region has fallen by almost 900 students (4.0%).
- There are 5,857 more seats than students enrolled in the region.

CHOICE


- 14% of CPS elementary students and 59% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 61% of CPS elementary students and 23% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school.
- Of CPS elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 47% travel under 1 mile. Of CPS high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 64% travel over 3 miles and 26% travel over 6 miles.

VARIETY

- Most elementary school programs are represented, although there are low numbers of STEM and IB seats (compared to the elementary student population).
- There is no Academic Center or RGC/Classical option.
- There are no selective enrollment high schools.
- The region also lacks a Fine & Performing Arts high school option.

The Greater Stockyards region is generally bounded by the Stevenson Expressway on the north, Central Park Ave on the west, 49th St on the south, and the Dan Ryan Expressway on the east. It contains parts of seven wards, six neighborhoods, and seven community areas. It is home to 154,000 residents and is served by seven train stops.





DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION

The Greater Stockyards region is majority Hispanic but growing in Asian student population.

The Greater Stockyards region CPS population is majority Hispanic, although in the past four years the percentage of Hispanic students has dropped from 78% to 76% as the percentage of Asian students has risen

from 12% to 14%. The percentage of students qualified for FRL has dropped from 94% to 86% in the past four years, which is higher than the district average.







Other

The Greater Stockyards region mostly encompasses neighborhoods of low- to medium- median household income.


HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

ELEMENTARY

Most of the Greater Stockyards region is encompassed by Level 1+/1 attendance area boundaries. There are also five Level 2+ attendance area schools and one Level 2 school, as well as seven citywide boundary schools.






HIGH SCHOOL

There are two attendance area high schools in the Greater Stockyards region – Kelly (Level 2+) and Tilden (Level 2). There are also some Level 2+/2 schools located outside the region with boundaries that extend into the region, and three citywide high schools in the region.







QUALITY

HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

There is an increasing number of Level 1+/1 elementary seats and a consistent number of Level 1+/1 high school seats.²





Over the past four years, the general trend has been an increase in Level 1+/1 seats for elementary schools and a relatively consistent number of seats per quality level for high schools. For elementary schools, however, the number of Level 1+/1 seats dropped by 1,560 in the past year. For high schools, the number of Level 1+/1 schools increased by 160 seats in the past year.





There is increasing enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools.



The percentage of CPS elementary students attending Level 1+/1 schools has increased since the 2014-2015 school year, although it dropped from 84% in the 2016-2017 school year to 78% in 2017-2018 school year. The percentage attending Level 2 schools is 4%.

The percentage of CPS high school students attending a Level 1+/1 school has increased each year since the 2014-2015 school year, from 38% in the 2014-2015 school year to 54% this year and last year.






The two largest CPS populations in the area are Asian students and Hispanic students. 89% of Asian students attend a Level 1+/1 school, compared to 70% of Hispanic students, and 88% of Asian students are at a Level 1+ school, compared to 41% of Hispanic students.





DO STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS?




ADMISSION TYPE OF LEVEL 1+/1 SCHOOLS




3,404 elementary students who live in the region do not attend a Level 1+/1 school (see previous page). There are 2,342 unfilled Level 1+/1 elementary seats in the region.

Of all Level 1+/1 elementary seats in the region, 76% are at attendance area schools and 24% have citywide boundaries. None have admissions criteria.

2,644 high school students who live in the region do not attend a Level 1+/1 school (see previous page). There are 474 unfilled Level 1+ seats.

100% of Level 1+ seats in the Greater Stockyards region have citywide boundaries. 50% have no admissions criteria, and 50% have some programs with criteria and a geographic preference area.







ARE STUDENTS CHOOSING SCHOOLS IN THEIR REGION?




School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice among CPS elementary school students has increased slightly over the past four years. The percentage of CPS students attending their zoned school has fallen from 65% to 61%, although the percentage leaving the region for school has increased from 12% to 14%.

- Attending Zoned School


ELEMENTARY SCHOOL³

Of the 14,799 CPS elementary students residing in the Greater Stockyards region, 79% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This percentage varies slightly across school choice and is highest for students who attend a non-zoned school in the region. 78% of students who attend their zoned school are at a Level 1+/1 school, compared to 89% of those attending a non-zoned school in the region and 68% of those attending school out of the region.

Of the 2,066 CPS elementary students who attend school outside the region (see above), 68% attend a Level 1+/1 school. Hispanic students are the largest racial/ethnic group, and attend Level 1+/1 schools at a lower rate – 61% are at Level 1+/1 schools. Asian students are the second-largest population and attend Level 1+/1 schools at the highest rate – 99% are at Level 1+/1 schools, including 94% at Level 1+ schools. There are almost 250 African American students who live in the region and attend school outside the region, and 44% are at Level 1+/1 schools and 23% are at Level 2 schools.







How are students exercising school choice, and how far are they traveling?




GREATER STOCKYARDS: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (K-8TH)










School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice has increased moderately among CPS high schoolers, although they are often choosing to stay in the region. The percentage of students attending their zoned school has dropped from 30% to 23%, and the percentage of students attending school out of the region has remained 59%.

Of the 5,862 CPS high school students in the region, 54% attend a Level 1+/1 school, but this percentage varies significantly by school choice. Of the students attending their zoned schools, none are at a Level 1+/1 school. For students who attend a non-zoned school in the region, 70% are at a Level 1+ school. For students who attend school outside the region, 72% are at Level 1+/1 schools, including 63% at Level 1+ schools.



Of the 3,452 CPS high school students attending school outside of the Greater Stockyards region (see above), 72% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This percentage varies by race/ethnicity. 92% of Asian students are at a Level 1+/1 school, compared to 68% of Hispanic students. Of the 149 African American students, 34% attend Level 2 schools.







GREATER STOCKYARDS: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (9TH-12TH)






VARIETY
