


KEY FINDINGS

QUALITY

- 92% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 85% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school.
- There are 47 schools, 42 of which are Level 1+/1.
- There are 2,878 unfilled seats in Level 1+/1 elementary schools in the region and 571 unfilled Level 1+/1 high school seats.
- 80% of Level 1+/1 elementary seats are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria and another 11% are at citywide schools with no criteria. 67% of Level 1+/1 high school seats require admissions criteria and have citywide boundaries.

QUANTITY

- The CPS population in the region has dropped by 2.1% (about 800 students) in the past four years, which is less than the 6.0% citywide decline.
- Enrollment in schools in the region has dropped by about 900 students, a decline of 2.3%.
- There are 2,752 more seats than students enrolled in the region.

CHOICE


- 16% of CPS elementary students and 29% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 66% of CPS elementary students and 30% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school.
- Of CPS elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 32% travel under 1 mile. Of CPS high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 42% travel over 3 miles and 16% travel over 6 miles.

VARIETY

- All elementary school programs are represented, although there is a low number of IB seats (compared to elementary student population).
- There are selective enrollment, IB, and CTE seats in the region.

The Northwest Side region is bounded generally by the city's border at W Devon Ave and W Howard St on the north, the Metra UP North Line / N Ravenswood Ave on the east, the I-90/94 Expressways on the west, and W Diversey Ave on the south. It is home to 266,000 residents and is served by 19 train stops.





DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION

The Northwest Side region has become slightly more White and Asian and less Hispanic.

The racial/ethnic composition of the Near West Side CPS population is 47% Hispanic, 24% White, 16% Asian, and 9% African American. The percentage of Hispanic students has dropped slightly in the past four years (from 50% to 47%) as the percentage of Asian

students has risen from 15% to 16% and the percentage of White students has risen from 22% to 24%. The percentage of students qualified for FRL has also dropped from 77% to 67% in the past four years, which is lower than the district average.







The Northwest side region encompasses neighborhoods primarily of high median income, with some pockets of lower-income neighborhoods.


HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

ELEMENTARY

Most of the Northwest Side region is encompassed by Level 1+/1 elementary school attendance boundaries, except for Roosevelt HS, which has 7th and 8th grades and is Level 2, and McPherson, which is Level 2+. There are also citywide schools throughout the region, most of which are Level 1+/1.






HIGH SCHOOL

There are three attendance area high schools in the Northwest Side region – Mather HS (Level 1), Amundsen (Level 1+), and Roosevelt (Level 2). There are also seven citywide schools, six of which are Level 1+. The boundaries for five other high schools extend into the region.






HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

There is a consistent number of Level 1+/1 seats.²



There are currently 47 schools in the Northwest Side region, including 37 elementary schools and 10 high schools. The number of Level 1+/1 schools has increased from 39 to 42 in the past four years.

The number of Level 1+/1 seats has generally been increasing for both elementary and high school. The number of Level 1+/1 elementary seats has increased by 1,470 in the past four years, and the number of Level 1+/1 high school seats has increased by 2,592 in the past four years.





There is increasing enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools.



The percentage of CPS elementary students attending Level 1+/1 schools has always been high and has increased each year. From the 2014-2015 school year to the 2017-2018 school year the percentage rose from 86% to 92%.

The percentage of CPS high school students attending Level 1+/1 schools has also increased each year. From the 2014-2015 school year to the 2016-2017 school year it increased from 50% to 84%, and this year it increased to 85%.





School quality is fairly consistent across race/ethnicity among CPS students. African American students attend Level 1+/1 schools at the lowest rate (79%) and Level 2 schools at the highest rate (8%).




DO STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS?

ADMISSION TYPE OF LEVEL 1+/1 SCHOOLS




Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 80% are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria and 11% are at citywide schools with no criteria. 7% are at attendance area schools that have some programs with criteria, and 2% are at citywide schools with criteria.

Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 67% are at citywide schools with admissions criteria. 14% are at schools with some programs with criteria, and 19% have no admissions criteria.








School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice among CPS elementary school students has been consistent in the past four years. 66% of students attend their zoned school and 16% leave the region for school.

SCHOOL QUALITY AND CHOICE



Of the 24,861 CPS elementary students residing in the Northwest Side region, 92% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This rate is relatively constant across school choice, and is highest for students who attend their zoned school (96%). 86% of students who attend a non-zoned school in the region are at a Level 1+/1 school, as are 83% of students who attend school out of region.



Of the 4,009 CPS elementary students who attend school outside of the region (see above), 83% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This number varies by race/ethnicity, however. 62% of African American students who choose to attend school out of region are going to a Level 1+/1 school, compared to 84% of Hispanic students and 95% of White students. 14% of African American students are choosing to attend a Level 2 school out of the region.





How are students exercising school choice, and how far are they traveling?




NORTHWEST SIDE: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (K-8TH)




School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice in the Northwest Side region has been increasing moderately among CPS high schoolers. In the past four years, the share of students attending their zoned school dropped from 36% to 30%, and the share of students leaving the region for school dropped from 26% to 29%.

HIGH SCHOOL



Of the 10,239 CPS high school students residing in the region, 85% attend a Level 1+/1 school. However, this rate varies moderately by school choice and is lower for students attending their zoned school. 67% of students attending their zoned school are at a Level 1+/1 school, including only 9% at Level 1+ schools, compared to 99% of students who attend a non-zoned school in the region (including 91% at Level 1+ schools). 85% of students who leave the region for school are at a Level 1+/1 school.




Of the 2,977 CPS high school students attending school outside the region (see above), 85% attend a Level 1+/1 school. However, these numbers vary by race/ethnicity. 94% of White students are at a Level 1+/1 school, compared to 86% of Hispanic students, 67% of African American students, and 75% of Asian students. 27% of African American students and 23% of Asian students are at Level 2 schools.





NORTHWEST SIDE: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (9TH-12TH)






VARIETY
