


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR¹

KEY FINDINGS

QUALITY

- 59% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school, and 49% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school.
- There are 35 schools 17 are Level 1+/1, 16 are Level 2+, one is Level 2 and one has an Inability to Rate rating.
- There are 3,105 unfilled Level 1+/1 elementary seats and 107 unfilled Level 1+/1 high school seats.
- 93% of Level 1+/1 elementary seats are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria. Of all Level 1+/1 high school seats, 75% do not have admissions criteria and 25% are at attendance area schools that have some programs with criteria.

QUANTITY

- The CPS population in the region has dropped by 10.6% (about 2,300 students) since the 2014-2015 school year, which is greater than the citywide decline of 6.0%.
- Enrollment in schools in the region has dropped even more (almost 2,800 students, or 12.7%).
- There are 6,965 more seats than students enrolled in the region.

CHOICE


- 10% of CPS elementary students and 40% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 70% of CPS elementary students and 25% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school.
- Of CPS elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 52% travel under 1 mile. Of CPS high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 45% travel over 3 miles and 15% travel over 6 miles.

VARIETY

- All elementary school magnet programs are represented, although the region lacks an Academic Center.
- There are no selective enrollment high schools.

The Pilsen/Little Village region is generally bounded by the METRA/BNSF rail line to the north, the Dan Ryan Expressway (I-90) to the east, the South Branch of the Chicago River and the Stevenson Expressway (I-55) to the south, and S Cicero Ave to the west. It is home to 115,000 residents and is served by six transit stops.




DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION

The Pilsen/Little Village region is primarily Hispanic.

The racial/ethnic composition of the Pilsen/Little Village CPS population is 96% Hispanic, 2% African American, 1% White, and 0% Asian. This has not changed in the

past four years. The percentage of students qualified for FRL has dropped from 97% to 90% in the past four years, which is higher than the district average.








There are 27 elementary schools, 14 of which are Level 1+/1. Elementary attendance areas are about half Level 1+/1 and half Level 2+. There are three citywide schools, all of which are Level 2+/2.



HIGH SCHOOL

There are two Level 2+ attendance area high schools – Juarez and Farragut – and two Level 1+ attendance area schools that share the same boundaries – Infinity and World Language High Schools. There are also two citywide high schools.




HOW MANY LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS ARE THERE?

There is a relatively consistent but increasing number of Level 1+/1 seats.2



There are currently 35 schools in the region, including 27 elementary schools and 8 high schools. 17 are Level 1+/1 schools, which is a drop from last year's 18 Level 1+/1 schools. The number of Level 2 schools has also fallen from 5 to 1 in the past year.

NOTE: This graph does not include Options or Specialty schools.



The number of Level 1+/1 elementary seats has increased by 1,035 seats in the past four years, including an increase of 615 in the past year. The number of Level 1+/1 high school seats has increased by 907 in the past four years, although it decreased by 203 seats in the past year. There are no Level 2 high school seats in the 2017-2018 school year.





There is generally increasing enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools.



The percentage of CPS elementary students attending Level 1+/1 schools has increased from 47% in the 2014-2015 school year to 59% in the 2017-2018 school year. The percentage of CPS elementary students attending Level 2 schools has dropped from 20% to 2%.

The percentage of CPS high school students who attend a Level 1+/1 school has increased from 35% to 49% in the past four years, and the percentage attending Level 2 schools has dropped from 44% to 1%. However, the percentage of CPS students attending Level 1+/1 schools has dropped from last year (52%).





There are few CPS students who live in the Pilsen/Little Village region who are not Hispanic. There are 354 African American students, 13% of whom are in Level 2 schools, compared to 2% of Hispanic students.




DO STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO LEVEL 1+/1 SEATS?



ADMISSION TYPE OF LEVEL 1+/1 SCHOOLS




Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 93% are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria. The other 7% are at attendance area schools that have some programs with criteria.

2,761 high school students who live in the region do not attend a Level 1+/1 school (see previous page). There are 107 unfilled Level 1+ seats in the region.

Of all Level 1+/1 seats, 46% are at citywide schools with no admissions criteria and 29% are at attendance area schools with no criteria. The other 25% are at attendance boundary schools that have some programs with criteria.






HOW MANY SEATS ARE THERE FOR THE STUDENT POPULATION?






Pilsen/Little Village region has dropped by about 2,325 students (10.6%), which is greater than the 6.0% citywide decline. The K-8th grade CPS population has decreased by 12.9% (compared to district 6.4%), while the 9-12th grade CPS population has remained relatively consistent (an increase of 16 students in four years, compared to the district decrease of 3.1%).



The number of students enrolled in the region has dropped by almost 2,800 students, a decline of 12.7%. K-8th grade enrollment has dropped by 13.2% and 9-12th grade enrollment has dropped by 6.6%.

9-12 K-8 PE & PK






School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice among CPS elementary school students has increased slightly in the Pilsen/Little Village region. The percentage of students attending their zoned school has fallen from 73% to 70% and the percentage attending school out of the region has increased from 8% to 10%.



Of the 13,224 CPS elementary students residing in the Pilsen/Little Village region, 59% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This number varies moderately by school choice. Of the 9,247 students who attend their zoned school, 63% attend a Level 1+/1 school and none attend a Level 2 school. For students who attend a nonzoned school in the region, only 35% attend a Level 1+/1 school and 10% attend Level 2 schools. For students who attend school out of the region, 77% are at Level 1+/1 schools and 6% are at Level 2 schools.



Of the 1,287 CPS elementary students who attend school out of the region (see above), 77% attend a Level 1+/1 school. 10% of students who attend school out of the region are African American (although they are only 2% of the students who live in the region). 17% of African American students who leave the region for school are at a Level 2 school, and only 44% are at a Level 1+/1 school.







PILSEN / LITTLE VILLAGE: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (K-8TH)




School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice in the Pilsen / Little Village region has increased significantly among CPS high schoolers. The percentage of high school students attending their zoned school has dropped from 36% to 25% in four years, and the percentage leaving the region has risen from 35% to 40%.

Of the 5,433 CPS high school students residing in the region, 49% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This number varies significantly by school choice. 100% of students attending their zoned high school are at a Level 2+ school. Of those who attend a non-zoned school in the region, 54% are at Level 1+/1 school. For students who attend school out of the region, 76% are at Level 1+/1 schools and 3% are at Level 2 schools.

Of the 2,171 CPS students who attend school out of the region (see above), 95% are Hispanic and 3% are African American. 29% of the African American students are at Level 2 schools, and 36% are at Level 1+/1 schools.








PILSEN / LITTLE VILLAGE: OUT OF REGION "CHOICE FOOTPRINT" (9TH-12TH)


