

**AUTHORIZE CONTINUED RETENTION OF THE LAW FIRM
EARL L. NEAL & ASSOCIATES, L.L.C.**

THE GENERAL COUNSEL REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Continued retention of the law firm Earl L. Neal & Associates, L.L.C..

DESCRIPTION: The General Counsel has continued to engage the services of Earl L. Neal & Associates, L.L.C. to provide legal opinion in connection with the Capital Improvement Program ("CIP"). The firm has handled all land acquisition matters for the CIP as well as obtained the necessary approvals from the Zoning Board of Appeals, Plan Commission and other regulatory bodies. The firm possesses significant expertise in these matters. Authorization for the firm's continued services is requested in the amount of \$125,000. As invoices are received, they will be reviewed by the General Counsel and, if satisfactory, processed for payment.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:




Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board Members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995, (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995, (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
