

### CPS students' reading gains rank among top 3 large districts in the nation, study finds

Research by Harvard and Stanford universities found Chicago's 3rd- to 8th-grade students outpaced most similar districts in reading growth from 2019 to 2023, while Illinois was one of only three states whose reading achievement now exceeds 2019 levels.


#### Reading Performance, Grades 3-8, 2016-2023


The percentage of CPS kindergartners tested for a gifted program in 2022 and 2022 ZIP code



# DRILLING MATHER READING PROGRESS

- Deprioritizing science and other topics can be counterproductive to raising studentachievement test scores in reading and math in the long run, said Christine Royce, a professor of science education at Shippensburg University in Pennsylvania.
- Studies have demonstrated that having a broader wealth of general background knowledge is linked to better reading-comprehension abilities.
