

How does contact tracing work?

STEP 1 Self-Report

CPS is notified of a case when the individual who has tested positive for COVID-19 reports their case at cps.edu/covidresults. While online reporting is preferred, you can call 773-553-KIDS to self-report.

*It is important that all individuals **diagnosed with COVID-19 self-report** using the COVID-19 Self-Reporting Tool by visiting cps.edu/COVIDresults. If the person is a minor, parents or legal guardian may submit this form on their behalf.*

- *CPS cannot act on the basis of hearsay, speculation, or second hand COVID-19 reports.*
- *The investigation process begins only when CPS receives the self-report of a COVID-19 positive case in the specified way.*



STEP 2 Intake Interview

A CPS Contact Tracer conducts an intake interview to determine if the individual who tested positive was in a CPS building during their contagious period. If so, the Contact Tracer determines what individuals were in close contact with them. A close contact is someone who was within six feet of the person who tested positive for 15 minutes or more during a single day. In some situations, a cohort may be asked to quarantine.



STEP 3 Notifications

CPS Contact Tracing Team will analyze the specific details of each investigation, and a Tracer will notify via email anyone present onsite in the building during the contagious period of a positive individual. Those identified as close contacts who are unvaccinated will be advised to quarantine at home for 5 days from the last date of exposure even if they do not have symptoms and have a negative test. Individuals who are up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines who do not have symptoms do not need to quarantine. It is recommended that anyone who is exposed be tested 5 days after the last date of exposure.



STEP 4 Close Contacts Quarantine

While in quarantine, students will switch to remote learning.
