## **COVID-19 Symptoms**

- Fever 100.4 or higher; chills
  - Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing

- New loss of taste or smell

## 3. Non-Student Household **Member is Sick With COVID-19 Symptoms**



1 Close contact: An individual who was within 6 ft of a known case for 15 min or more during the contagious period (2 days before illness onset and 10 days after first symptom).

2 Are you up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines doses? This means: For people 18 years or older: You received all recommended vaccine doses, including boosters and additional primary shots for some immunocompromised people. For people 5-17 years old: You completed the primary series of COVID-19 vaccines

3 Quarantine: Keeps a person who was in close contact with someone from COVID-19 away from others.

4 High suspicion: An individual who is highly likely to be infected with COVID-19 due to a close contact with a confirmed positive or because they are presenting with loss of taste or smell. 5 Isolate: Keeps a person who is sick and/or tested positive for COVID-19 away from others (even in their own home).

isolate<sup>5</sup> for 5 days from start of illness. Individuals should NOT continue to test after testing positive. A negative test is not required to return to school, and it is possible to test positive even though you are no longer infectious.

Household members who are unvaccinated or not up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines must guarantine for 5 days and wear a mask for an additional 5 days. Students with mask exemptions cannot return to school before 10 days.

Vaccinated household members who are non-symptomatic are not required to quarantine.
