

# What To Do If You Test Positive For COVID-19

If you have any of these COVID-19 symptoms, you should get tested:

- Fever 100.4 or higher; chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
- New muscle or body aches
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
- Headache
- Runny nose or congestion
- Fatigue



**1. Report the positive case to CPS at [cps.edu/covidresults](https://cps.edu/covidresults).** Any student or staff member who tests positive for COVID using a rapid test or a test administered by a health care provider must report the case to CPS. If someone tests positive through CPS' weekly in-school testing program, the case is automatically reported to CPS. **2. Isolate at home for at least five days.** If symptoms persist after five days, continue to isolate at home until symptoms resolve.



**3. Return to school after isolation and wear a mask until ten days after symptom onset or ten days after the positive test if asymptomatic.**
