## Student Strengths

Provide 3-5 statements to describe your child's strengths, interests, and preferences. Consider including:

<p><b>Academic:</b> What can your child do in all academic areas, independently and with prompting?</p>	
<p><b>Developmental:</b> What can your child do in terms of fine and gross motor activities, communication, self-help skills?</p>	
<p><b>Functional:</b> What can your child do in terms of independent and executive functioning skills, how does your child interact with other children and/or adults in settings outside of school?</p>	
<p><b>Transition:</b> How does your child access environments outside of the school (e.g. home, playground, restaurants, etc.)?</p>	
<p><b>Interests:</b> What interests does your child have? What does your child like to do outside of school? What is your child's favorite subject?</p>	
<p><b>Social Emotional:</b> Does your child build relationships? Identify his/her emotions? Make decisions? Manage conflict?</p>	

## Student Needs

Provide 3-5 statements to describe your child's developmental/functional, communication and transition needs. Consider highlighting needs in the following areas: fine and gross motor, self-help skills, interacting and/or communicating with other children and adults, accessing a variety of environments like home,
