## Office of Diverse Learner Supports and Services: Universal Enrichment Remedy (UER) Calls



Your child is eligible for a UER because CPS has determined that his/her services may have been delayed or denied due to special education procedural problems identified by ISBE.

The Notice of Conference identifies the area and year relevant to your student. Students are entitled to the remedies in the following amounts for each year identified. If your student is identified in multiple areas, he/she is entitled to the combined amount, up to a maximum of \$4,000 per year.

Transportation	Extended School Year (ESY)	Paraprofessional	Specific Learning Disability (SLD)
If your student missed 10+ consecutive school days as a result of not having transportation services, \$225 to \$337.50.	\$800	\$2,000	\$4,000
If your student attended school, reimbursement for mileage or transportation expenses.			

- You can use the money for the remedies listed <u>here.</u> including:
  - Services from approved providers
  - <u>Reimbursement</u> for services you obtained for your student
  - o Reimbursement for future services you obtain for you student
  - Services from a CPS teacher or related services provider
- You can also choose to receive a Chromebook.
- On the scheduled call, a representative on behalf of the district will answer your questions, talk with you about choosing a remedy, and explain the required <u>waiver</u>.
